<p>Winter Birds</p> <p>Create a festive winter treat or feeder for the birds in your garden. Show us how you made it and perhaps take a photo of any birds enjoying it!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>	<p>Winter Fairy Tale / Myth</p> <p>Write a short fairy tale or myth set in the snowy winter. Or create & illustrate a factfile about a fictional, snowy winter wonderland!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1.5 CU hours</p>	<p>Christmas Coding</p> <p>Visit the 'Code Club' website, or use your own coding skills, to create a project with a Christmas or wintry theme.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">2 CU hours</p>	<p>Gingerbread Treats</p> <p>Make and decorate some gingerbread (or cinnamon) treats for your family/friends. Write up the recipe & show us a photo of the finished result!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1.5 CU hours</p>
<p>Christmas Truce</p> <p>Find out about the 'Christmas truce of 1914'. Write a summary with an illustration, or write a letter 'home' from one of the WWI soldiers.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1.5 CU hours</p>	<p>Winter Science</p> <p>Carry out a winter-themed science experiment such as a snowstorm in a jar. Present a short report explaining what you have discovered.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>	<p>Write a Review</p> <p>Go to the theatre, watch a Christmas movie or read a book that has a Christmas or winter theme. Write a review to tell others about it.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>	<p>Christmas of the Past</p> <p>Talk to an older family member about their childhood Christmases. Choose an interesting way to present what you've learnt.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>
<p>Christmas Crackers</p> <p>Create some colourful Christmas crackers. Either pull them with your family or use them to decorate the table or Christmas tree!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>	<p>National Bird: Robin</p> <p>Britain's national bird is the robin. Either create a fact file about the robin or make a robin-themed Christmas decoration.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>	<p>Go Stargazing</p> <p>Go stargazing with your family. What constellations can you spot? What phase is the moon? Did you see the ISS? Write a short report.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>	<p>Learning Destinations</p> <p>Create a poster that we could use in the New Year, to advertise your favourite local Children's University™ Learning Destination</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1 CU hour</p>

What do I do when I've finished an activity?

When you've completed your chosen activity challenge, you'll need to show us some evidence so that we can add the learning Children's University™ hours to your passport. Remember to label your completed challenges with your name, school year and the name of the challenge.
