Flying Machines—Engineering

Topic Overview

This term our topic is 'Flying Machines—Engineering.'

We will be exploring the work of the Wright Brothers and how aviation has developed throughout history. We will be examining different types of flying machines, including hot air balloons, aeroplanes, helicopters and gliders. The children will identify how these have changed as a result of modern engineering techniques. Subject Coverage	
Literacy	This term in literacy we will be exploring "My Dad's a Birdman". We will read this book in class and use it as inspiration to write using dialogue, to create diary entries and finally; to explore the writing styles that surround newspaper reports.
Maths	In maths this term we will be looking at fractions and their equivalents. We will also be exploring decimals
Science	In science this term we are investigating forces and gravity; looking closely at, and investigating resistance.
