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Dear Parents,

Within this newsletter you will see this week's activities that have been enriching our pupil's experiences. Some Year of 6 travelled to Kettering on Thursday to take part in a **Student Leadership Development** day. This day was organised through the United Learning Academy Trust and joined our primary with 4 other United Learning primaries. The pupils shared ideas and learnt new skills around leading change on others. They have come up with a number of ideas and I look forward to seeing them develop over the next few months.

Anti-Bullying Week & Pupil Ambassadors – Application Forms

Following on from my assembly to pupils around the National Anti-Bullying Week (14-18 Nov) where I have re-capped on how as a school, we work together, as a community to restore relationships. If a child reports a relationship breakdown or has been on the receiving end of 'incidents of unkindness' or 'bullying', we use restorative principles in the form of supported meetings to repair the harm. During these meetings, we talk about the importance of understanding others emotions and respect within our community also, that we all own our feelings, thoughts and most importantly our behaviour choices.

The meetings provide an opportunity for pupils that have harmed or been harmed to reflect on how others have been affected and to allow them the space to repair any damage. The impact of this is that the children begin to understand how others have been affected by their behaviour choices, their responsibility to the hurt caused but also crucially that they can offer restorative solutions to the problem. It is important to remember that children need to be given a chance to forgive, learn, respect and understand how their choices impact others. Often the children can be their hardest critic and we have a responsibility to help them move away of feelings of shame when wrong choices have been made and reintegrate them back into our school community. *Believe me these meetings are no soft option.* If you want to know more about this, please do call me or refer to the school's Anti-Bullying Policy.

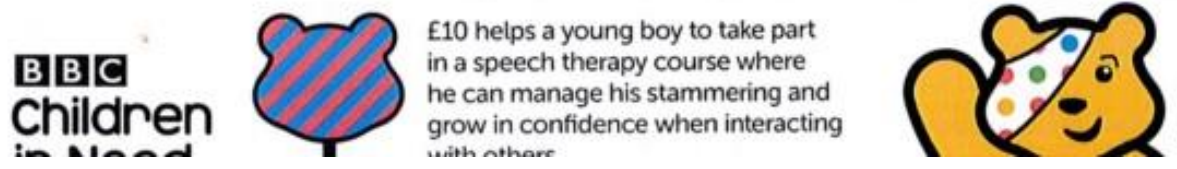
