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Dear Parents,

Pupil Voice and attitude to learning at Hanwell

Last Friday the whole school went into circle time after lunch to discuss their thoughts around the following two questions:

Do I work hard at school? and how do I know?

On Monday this week, the note takers/class representatives met with me to discuss their findings and consider next steps. The majority of Pupil Voice believe that they do work hard and were very honest that at times it could be related to topics they like. We then considered the difference between behaviours that enable learning and learning powers. Pupils demonstrated and accepted that they felt growth mindset was working but they are now ready to take on growth mindset Stage II building resilience and independence further in the classroom. To do this we are, as a school community, going to work on learning episodes in the lesson of collaboration, teacher pupil talk/instruction and silent time to build independence and resilience. These ideas were unanimously agreed to by the class representatives. In assemblies today, I have spoken to the pupils about the importance of believing in themselves and their abilities of being super learners.

Year 6 '7Billionideas' Roadshow

This week we welcomed 7Billionideas roadshow where they spend time launching their United 2017 competition to our Year 6's. Year 6 will now spend a day next week developing their world changing ideas that will give them a chance to explore their imaginations, develop new skills and hopefully we may see some turn into 'entrepreneurs'.

Outside Gym Equipment

Please can I express that before and after school that children are not left to play on the school equipment. We have had cases of children helping themselves, and climbing on the equipment. The equipment has age and height enabling limits which are clearly labelled.

Inspire Maths workshop – Raising standards in maths at Hanwell Fields

It was great to see so many families from our whole school community attend the workshop on Tuesday evening. We explained why Inspire is so different and how the aspirational framework is helping children to develop their fluency in maths. Probably the most successful part of the evening was showing the parents how we use concrete items in school to help our children develop their conceptual thinking, moving into pictures (bar modelling and part-part whole method).

If you were unable to attend we are holding another workshop on **2nd November at 3.30pm** to show you in more detail, how bar modelling and pictures can develop children's mathematical understanding.
