-	Create your own nature sculpture in your garden or at the park using natural objects and send in a photo	
-	Tiny treasure hunt - How many woodland treasures can you fit in a matchbox or raisin box?	
-	Design your own Gruffalo –can you describe what he looks?	
-	Find out 5 fascinating facts about trees	
-	Go on a nature hunt – how many different natural objects can you find e.g. pine cones, conkers, leaves, twigs, feathers. Make a bar chart or tally to show your findings
