This means that Caroline Tomlinson (Assistant Head) along with Matt Johns (Yr3) will be actively developing our school's maths teaching and learning, through studying effective practice alongside other colleagues from the research group; some of which have worked in Singapore focusing on the impact of the Bar Method on children's metacognition. I am really looking forward to where this takes us as a school and the impact on pupil outcomes!

Want to join us on our journey with the Children's University™ ?

Our school is a member of the Children's University[™] scheme and we have now issued 105 Children's University[™] passports through our school! If your child would like to join us on a journey of learning and fun whilst earning learning hours in their own Children's University[™] passport whilst collecting awards and certificates along the way, please read on to find out more.

The Children's University[™] is an extra-curricular learning programme which takes place outside of the school day and encourages 5 to 14 year olds to try new experiences, develop new interests, acquire new skills and have fun through learning within a variety of different areas. The learning is voluntary and children may participate as little or as often as they wish.

All children who join the Children's University[™] are given an individual 'Passport to Learning' in which they can collect and record the hours of learning (credits) that they have achieved through taking part in Children's University[™] accredited learning activities.

How can my child collect Children's University[™] learning hours?

Learning hours can be earned in various ways through a growing number of different Learning Destinations and other sources such as through:

- After-school clubs at Hanwell Fields Community School
- Holiday challenge sheets from Hanwell Fields Challenge School
- Local and national Learning Destinations
- Online worksheets accredited by the Children's University[™]

Children's University™ Certificates

Children's University[™] hours are logged in the passports and these count towards certificates and awards which are given out in the end of term assemblies at the school. At the first Children's University[™] Undergraduate Level (30 to 400 hours) these are issued as bronze, silver and gold certificates through each of the categories of Awards, Certificates, Diplomas and Degrees (see Passport for details).

How to Join Children's University™

If your child would like to join us on our journey with the Children's University™, please log onto your 'ParentPay' account to pay the one-off payment of £5 to cover the cost of the passport, also ensuring that you also give your child's name and year. Children's University™ passports will then be issued before the end of term, ready for collecting any Children's University™ hours over the holidays! Surf Protect

At Hanwell Fields we understand the importance of keeping children and staff safe online. Content filtering is an important part of keeping students safe, making sure that they don't see inappropriate content online, from adult content to hate speech. With an incredible amount of educational resources available online, students now use the Internet far more often, and schools need an effective content filtering solution more than ever before. That is why we use Surf protect provided by EXA networks.

We have the ability to filter content to our required needs and allow only certain content through our firewall when we need it. We encourage use of Purple mash for online educational gaming and each pupil now has their own logon from KS1 upwards so we are able to monitor safely and have much more control.

The pupils also have the use of IPad's which are for lesson time only and not for Break times. We have signed up with Zuludesk to manage them more efficiently and safely in class allowing us to set lesson plans and share work with the teacher.

Sports, PE and After School Clubs

Children in years 1, 3, 4 and 6 have been developing their orienteering skills this term. They have been reading maps and following clues around the school grounds to find orienteering flags with clues on them that give them a secret message. We have benefited from excellent weather so far this term with only one wet afternoon so they have made tremendous progress in their planning and searching methods. Year 5 swimmers have made great progress with lots of certificates awarded already and the majority of children now in the 25m pool. All good for the swimming gala coming up in November.

This week saw our first competitive sport of the year with the Banbury area cross country at Banbury Academy. We took a team of 47 – though many more wanted to run – from across the school. 10 schools entered with 6 different races. We performed superbly finishing 4th overall but managed to have 1st place in 3 races and 2nd in another. We have 6 children qualified for the North Oxfordshire finals in November so special mention to: Blake Hunter, Lucas Hunter and Kaitlynn Hendrickz who all won their race and to Sophie Lister (5th), Kristin Senior (2nd) and Lucie Upton (10th) who qualify by finishing in the top 10 of their race. Also a very well done to the year 2's who raced – for many of them it was their first experience of a big event like this which is very daunting but they all ran brilliantly!

Coming up we have the year 3/4 football tournament and the 5/6 tag rugby tournament – both before half term and we are working on netball and football fixtures against Hill View and Bishop Loveday so there is, as always, lots of sport going on at Hanwell Fields.


