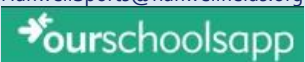

Izzy's Easy Peasy Recipes

Chocolate Raspberry Brownies



Ingredients	Method
200g dark chocolate broken into chunks	1. Heat over to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Line a 20 x 30cm baking tray with baking parchment. Put the chocolate, butter and sugar in a pan and gently melt, stirring occasionally with a wooden spoon. Remove from heat.
100g milk chocolate, broken into chunks	
250g salted butter	
400g soft light brown sugar	2. Stir in the eggs, one by one, into the melted chocolate mixture. Sieve over the flour and cocoa, and stir in half the raspberries, scrape into the tray, then scatter over the remaining raspberries. Bake on the middle shelf for 30 mins or, if you prefer a firmer mixture, leave for 5 mins more. Cool before slicing into squares. Store in an airtight container for up to 3 days.
4 large eggs	
140g plain flour	
50g cocoa powder	
200g raspberries, preferably frozen
