Year 1 pupils will become botanists this term and will identify and name a variety of common and wild garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. We will be studying plants across the curriculum, reading *Jack and the Beanstalk* in Literacy to grouping plants and pictures in maths. In ICT we will be developing a plant record database. Subject Coverage

English	The children will be exploring the fairy tale 'Jack and the Beanstalk' written by Richard Walker. We will be concentrating on the vocabulary used specifically in this version of the tale. We will also move on to writing instructions linked with growing plants.
Maths	This term we will be developing our multiplication and division skills, using the language of groups of and lots of and looking at why it is important to share equally. The main focus will be the use of objects and pictures to make groups and show multiplication.
Science	Pupils will be introduced to a wide variety of plants, including trees that are found on the school grounds, gaining hands on experience exploring and investigating plants. The main enquiry this term is grouping and classifying.
History/ Geography	The class will find out more about the town, country and continent they live in. They will find out where the United Kingdom is located on a world map and explore the features of the countries and capital cities of the UK, before finding out about their local area.
Computing	Using Purple Mash pupils will create a plant database of common wild and garden plants found on the school grounds.
D and T	We will be building our own daffodil windmills, designing our own flowers using Purple Mash and creating a garden plot using common garden flowers.
Music	Use of the glockenspiel with Mrs Heywood
R.E.	"Why is the Torah special?" Year 1 will find out what Judaism is and explore what the Torah and other Holy books are and why they are important.
P.E.	Swimming and multi-skill event at Banbury academy
