Subject Coverage			
Literacy	Through our quality text, we shall focus upon editing our work with a partner to improve the sentence structure and range of vocabulary relevant to the text-type. Later in the term, we will be writing and developing scripts for our videos about WWII and practising reading aloud with expression.		
Maths	We continue using Inspire maths, focusing upon how we can show our under- standing in a variety of ways. Concrete items and bar models will help us with Place value, Comparing numbers and rounding. This year we have re-introduced times tables tests to develop speedier recall of facts.		
Science	We are working on a very important mission from Professor Who. We will be learn- ing about sound this term to help us find out what the best material would be to sound-proof an attic.		
History	In history this term, we will be learning about the major events in WWII and how and why it began. We will then go on to look in more detail at what life was like for children during the war, and comparing it with life now.		
Computing	We'll be using a variety of media programmes to film and edit our own information videos. We will be linking this to our topic this term		
D and T	During our D and T lessons we will be learning about drawing in proportion and physically exploring an original WWII gas mask in order to make our own replicas.		
R.E.	Improving our understanding of Hinduism and the traditions and ideology that underpin it.		
P.E.	This term in P.E. we will be developing map-reading skills, team-work and our fitness, in the high-octane sport of Orienteering.		
SMSC	This year we extend the successful Burnet News to Years 4 and 5 where we study current affairs developing key skills of logic, curiosity, questioning and scepticism.		
French	We continue with French, practising saying colours and giving opinions about situations.
