

'Victorians' takeaway homework

For example, you may want to take photos of any practical homework and create a poster alongside any written work you have chosen. Please note, homework will be evidenced in our 'Victorian' Learning Journeys and may be used for display around the school.

Activity	Points	x
Bake a traditional Victoria Sponge and bring in some photos of you making it.	3	
Create a poster advertising a new invention made during the Victorian era – try to convince people that is a 'must-have' item and convince them to buy!	3	
Research Victorian money – what coins did they have? How much would they be worth today? What did people get paid for their jobs? How does that compare to today?	2	
Create a word search for key Victorian vocabulary and decorate the page.	2	
Take some photos of Victorian buildings in your local area and present the information in an interesting way.	3	
Paint a Victorian scene – it could be of the Workhouse, the countryside or just people dressed in Victorian clothes.	3	
Write a diary entry from the point of view of someone in the Workhouse – include facts about how they were treated.	2	
Research and make a Victorian toy – who might have used the toy? How could you make it look authentic?	4	
Research typical Victorian boys and girls names. Choose a boy and a girl and sketch them paying particular attention to their clothes.	2	
Using Scratch, code a Victorian game. Think about where it will be set and what the challenge might be.	4	
Sketch a variety of typical Victorian wallpapers (researching William Morris might help) and choose one to create on A4 paper, explaining why you have chosen this design.	3
