By the end of the term, you need to collect at least 12 points, or 18 if you want to collect a lucky dip prize! You will get extra points for particularly creative work, and if you present your all your homework tasks as one completed project in the last week, you will earn yourself an extra 2 points.

Make a fact file about a key figure from World War 2 (e.g. Hitler, Winston Churchill etc). (2 points)

Make a set of Top Trumps cards relating to WW2. (3 points)

Using a coding programme, animate a scene from the Blitz. (4 points)

Draw a portrait of a key figure from WW2 and write a short character description to go with it. (3 points)

Build your own trench, either as a sculpture or on a computing programme. (2 points)

Research and make a dish that could be made with rations from WW2. Share it with your family, then make a review. This could be written or recorded. (3 points)

Make a model of an Anderson Shelter. (2 points)

Pack a bag as if you are about to be evacuated. Write a list of everything you have chosen to bring and why you have chosen it. (2 points)

Do a labelled diagram of a WW2 plane. (2 points)

Research and present the story of an evacuee from WW2. You could ask family members, friends or do some research. (2 points)

Draw/paint/collage a WW2 scene. (2 point)

Write a poem about how you would feel if you're Dad left to fight in the war. (3 points)

Write a biography of a pilot from the RAF. (3 points)

Create a map of where children were evacuated from and to. (2 points)

Colour code a map of Europe to show where Germany invaded during the war. (2 point)

Design and create your own propaganda poster about something you really believe in. (3 points)

Make your own WW2-themed board game. (3 points)
