

School E-safety Update

Snapchat has developed a new feature that has raised a lot of concerns. I just wanted to let you all know about it (especially if you have children of your own who are on snapchat!)

The feature is known as 'Snap Maps' or 'Stalk My Friends' and it allows users to track their friends in real time. We all know that most young people are allowing strangers to add them on Snapchat, so this means anybody can see their exact location pinpointed on a map. Most people's phones will update the app automatically, so they could have this feature activated without realising it. There is also a way to track peoples' activity – i.e. the app will tell you where your friend is and if they are listening to music/sleeping/at home etc.

Users can enter 'ghost mode', which will hide their location completely, or they can choose to share their location with certain people and not others. It is extremely important that we make children aware of this feature, as it is potentially very dangerous.

How do you enable ghost mode in snapchat?

1. Open Snapchat and go to the camera function.
2. Pinch to zoom to open the Snap Map.
3. Tap on the settings gear in the top right-hand corner
4. Tick the box that says "Enable Ghost Mode."

We will be issuing a new Hanwell field's e-safety booklet next week and this will be updated termly aimed at year 4-6
